

The Provincial Nesika Awards seek to honour exceptional people and initiatives that find unique and innovative ways to bring diverse cultures together and demonstrate the benefits of cultural diversity.

## Nomination categories and eligibility requirements:

- **Individual:** Any living individual, over the age of 30, whose main residence is in British Columbia.
- **Youth:** Any living youth between the ages of 15-30 whose main residence is in British Columbia.
- **Business:** Any public or private for-profit business registered in British Columbia, or a British Columbia office or branch of a national or international business. The nomination may be for the work of the business overall, or for a specific initiative undertaken to improve respect and dignity between diverse cultures within the operations of the business.
- **Organization:** Any organization, operating for a primary purpose other than financial profit, with an office in British Columbia. The nomination may be for the work of the organization overall, or for a specific initiative undertaken to improve respect and dignity between diverse cultures within the community the organization serves.

# **Terms and Conditions**

## Award Money:

Award money is not intended for individual gain. Nominees will be asked to identify an organization to receive their cash award to be used for the further advancement of multiculturalism in BC. The selected organization must agree to accept the award and must be registered and active in British Columbia. An award winner in the organization or business category may designate their organization as the award recipient, provided they meet the qualifications.

## **Nominations:**

A nominee cannot be nominated in more than one category in any one year.

The nominee or representative agrees to the use of applicant information and/or being interviewed or photographed for publicity purposes.

## Judging:

Neither the Province of British Columbia Employees nor elected representatives will have involvement in, or influence over, the selection of nominees or winners.

The Multicultural Advisory Council will appoint an independent selection panel that is objective, respected and knowledgeable in the area of multiculturalism and anti-racism.

The process of evaluating nominees and selecting winners is at the discretion of the independent selection panel. The selection panel has the option of not making an award in all categories.

In reviewing the nominations, the judges will consider the contributions and achievements in regards to:

- raising awareness of diversity, multiculturalism and anti-racism issues
- promoting respect and inclusion
- creating a welcoming environment
- the use of the award money to further advance multiculturalism in British Columbia
