Wish kid Amelia was two weeks old when she was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis (CF). In her life she has endured thousands of hours of treatments, taken tens of thousands of pills and other medications, and has had several hospital admissions. She has a painful related condition called distal intestinal obstruction syndrome that requires daily maintenance. She is monitored closely to watch for common complications, such as CF-related diabetes and CF-related liver disease.



And as she's grown, and endured all these medical interventions in her young life, what she wanted most was to go camping.

"Tent camping wasn't something we were able to do," explained Amelia's mom, Jessica. Her treatments need access to power, running water and facilities to sterilize her equipment." Once the world of Make-A-Wish was introduced to Amelia the idea of a trailer started taking shape, and one day, in June 2017, her wish became reality with the help of Fraserway RV.
