3. Collaboration is key.

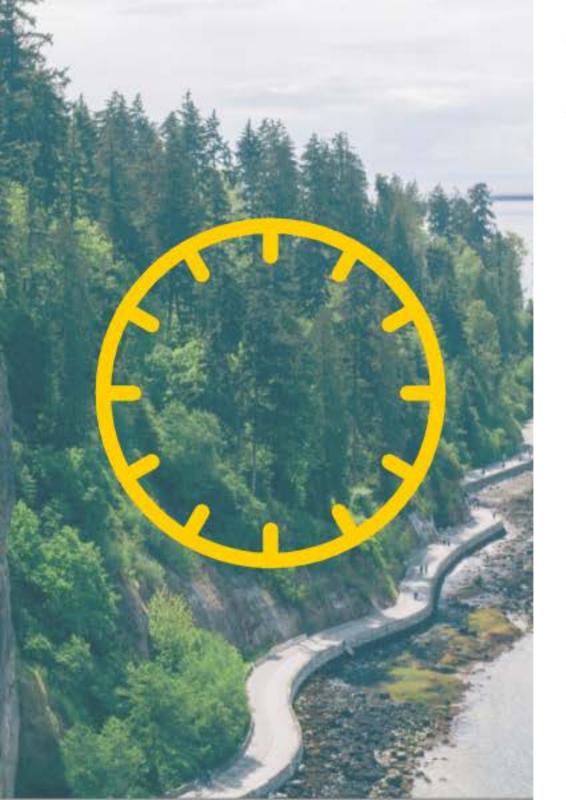
Real estate projects and dealings require many different professions to work together. You must be able to work well with others. Building a reputation as a team player that brings value to a project will advance your career.

6. Education prepares, designation leads.

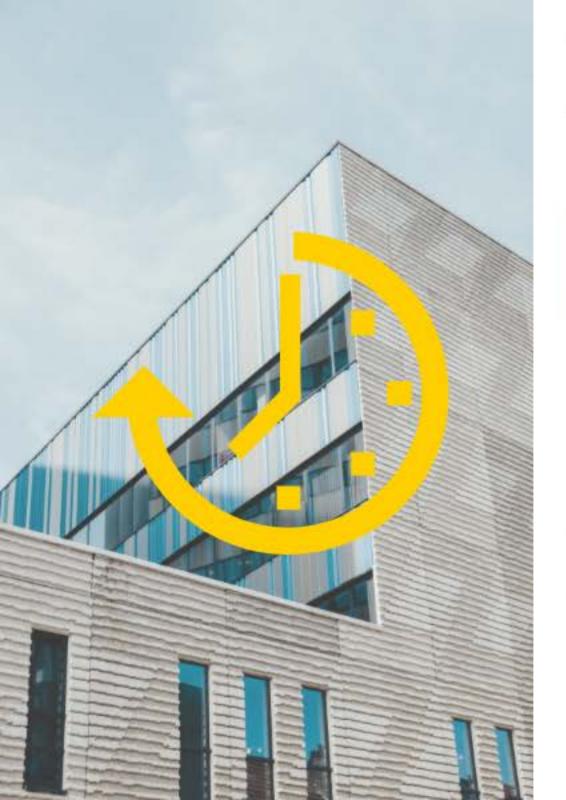

8. Work hours are flexible.

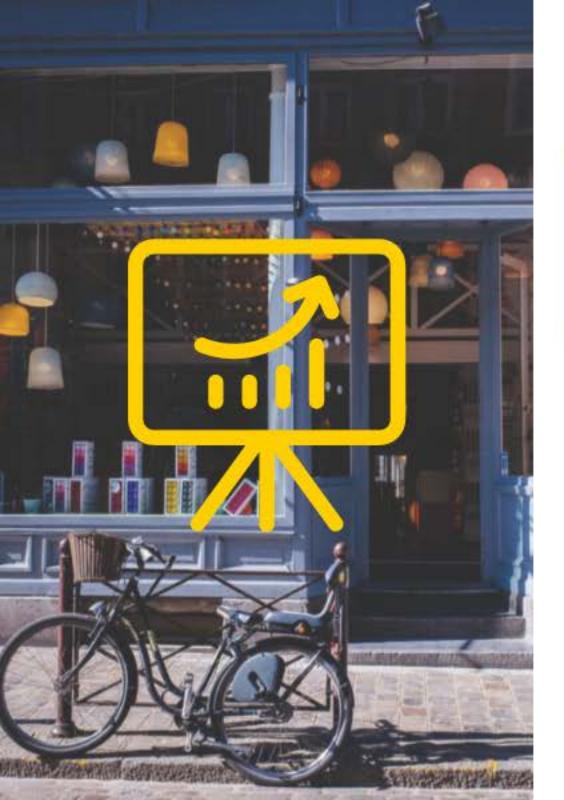
Some professions may provide the option to work from home or have flexible hours. There is room for you to create your own schedule if that is important to you. Consider this when researching real estate professions.
